Discuss <u>three</u> of the following:

- a. The so-called dual role of the Lord Advocate;
- b. The Scottish Legal Complaints Commission;
- c. Solicitors' rights of audience;
- d. The Advocate General for Scotland.

Question 3

- a. Explain the meaning and significance of s 3 of the Human Rights Act 1998.
- b. Explain the circumstances in which Hansard may be used as an aid to statutory interpretation.

Question 4

Explain when a judge sitting in the Inner House of the Court of Session would consider herself or himself bound to follow reasoning contained in a previous decision.
